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MEDICARE LEVY RELATED ITEMS

Pages 73–81 in Retirees TaxPack 2003 will help you to correctly fill in these items.

Medicare levy reduction or exemption 25

NOTE

Exemption categories

Only certain taxpayers are entitled to a Medicare levy reduction or exemption. Read question 25 in Retirees TaxPack 2003 to work out if you are eligible to claim.

Full 1.5% levy exemption—number of days



If you have completed item 25 and had a spouse during 2002–03 you must also complete Spouse details-married or de facto on page 5 of your tax return.

26 Medicare levy surcharge



If you do not complete this item you may be charged the full Medicare levy surcharge (MLS).

To help you determine if you have to pay the surcharge read pages 77-81 in Retirees TaxPack 2003.

For the whole period 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2003 were you and your spouse-married or de facto (if you had one)-covered by private patient HOSPITAL cover?



For the whole of 2002–03 were you:

- a single person and your taxable income for MLS purposes (including your total reportable fringe benefits amounts) was \$50,000 or less, OR
- married—including a de facto relationship—and the combined taxable income for MLS purposes (including the total reportable fringe benefits amounts) of you and your spouse was \$100,000 or less?

You do not have to pay the surcharge—you must write '365' at A.

You must write the following at A:

- '0' when you have to pay the surcharge for the whole period 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2003
- '365' when you do NOT have to pay the surcharge for the whole period 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2003
- the number of days you do NOT have to pay the surcharge for part of the period 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2003.

If you had a spouse during 2002–03 complete **Spouse details—married or de facto** on page 5 of your tax return.

If you were covered by private patient hospital cover at any time during 2002–03 you must complete Private health insurance policy details on page 3 of your tax return.

If you completed any of the items listed below, and you had a spouse during 2002–03, you must complete **Spouse details—married or de facto**. We need the information included in this section to accurately assess your tax obligations.

Is your tax return complete?

Before you lodge your tax return, check that you have:

- written your tax file number at the top of page 1 of your tax return
- filled in all your personal details on page 1 of your tax return
- filled in the appropriate details on page 1 of your tax return if you want to use electronic funds transfer to have your refund paid directly into your financial institution account
- filled in the code boxes—if applicable—at items 1 and 20
- completed item 26—it is compulsory for all taxpayers
- completed **Spouse details—married or de facto**, if applicable
- completed Private health insurance policy details, if applicable
- written totals at TOTAL TAX WITHHELD, TOTAL INCOME, TOTAL DEDUCTIONS, TAXABLE INCOME and TOTAL TAX OFFSETS
- attached to the top left-hand corner of page 3 of your tax return copies of your payment summaries and other requested documents
- signed and dated the *Taxpayer's declaration* below.

Commissioner's guarantee

Taxpayers who use *Retirees TaxPack 2003* properly to complete their tax return are protected by the Commissioner's guarantee. The guarantee is on the inside front cover of *Retirees TaxPack 2003*.

TAXPAYER'S DECLARATION

I declare that:

- all the information I have given in this tax return, including any attachments, is true and correct
- I have shown all my income—including net capital gains for tax purposes from sources in and out of Australia for 2002–03
- I have completed item 26—Medicare levy surcharge
- I have the necessary receipts and/or other records—or expect to obtain the necessary written evidence within a reasonable time of lodging this tax return—to support my claims for deductions and tax offsets, and
- I understand the ATO has the right to review my tax return and, for a period of up to 6 years, to issue me with a revised assessment if a review shows any inaccuracies in income or entitlement that change my assessment.

Did *Retirees TaxPack 2003* ask you to attach additional information to your tax return?

Privacy

It is not an offence not to quote your tax file number (TFN). However, your assessment will be delayed if you do not quote your TFN.

The ATO is authorised by the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1936* and the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* to ask for

All taxpayers must sign and date the declaration below.

information on this tax return. We need this information to help us to administer the taxation laws.

We may give this information to other government agencies authorised by law to receive it—for example, benefit payment agencies such as Centrelink, the Department of Education, Science and Training and the Department of Family and Community Services; law enforcement agencies such as the National Crime Authority; and other agencies such as the Child Support Agency, the Australian Bureau of Statistics and the Reserve Bank of Australia.

IMPORTANT

The tax law imposes heavy penalties for giving false or misleading information.
